### **SHED**

- Not that big, 12x12 is way too large a car can fit inside
- Smaller for lawn and pool equipment
- Allow sheds but do not specify where they should be placed. You could limit the kind of shed or building material or size of shed
- Should have to have it tucked away by your home like behind a garage
- No larger than 10 x 10
- No larger than 8x8 then we may consider it
- Only 4x8 if needed
- Consider different placement for size and kind of lot, the "fishbowl" lots facing each other may require placement closer to a house or where is least visible to neighbors. Maybe have a placement guideline available for the different kinds of lots along with materials guideline on the website.

# **GARDENS**

- Need a better definition of raised garden and height restriction against corn, sunflowers, etc.
- Size allowed is too big
- 4x4 ' or 2'4' with a minimum #
- We live in a very open area of Littlefield Ct, it is not conducive to have raised beds at the back of property. That is our open park area. I believe you either allow raised beds and do not specify where they should be located.
- Not totally against but feel ¼ of yard is too large, yard sizes greatly differ and some are extra large
- Placement of bed not in corner of back yard, allowed to be closer to house but not visible from street
